We have recently implemented our latest policy on mobile phone use at the SS and have received very positive feedback from parents and staff. Perhaps not so much from students, but we believe that in the longer term this will become fully accepted. In the meantime, we are in the process of exploring how we can further develop our digital strategy in the school for pedagogical and other administrative uses. Indeed, we have set up a team dedicated to what we term 'Digital Transformation' with a view to establishing a 3-year strategic plan that aims to set new standards of excellence through innovative and technology-driven education. Essentially what this means is our taking on an analysis of our current status, our needs and key objectives, which will lead to the establishment of a basis upon which we plan to build a dynamic and responsive digital ecosystem.

Our key objectives include a number of features such as utilizing technology to support engaging and interactive learning experiences, to foster critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills through digital tools and resources, allowing students to feel comfortable and confident with the use of digital resources. We also are focused on promoting better parental engagement through channels and platforms as well as placing data at the centre of much of our school and student improvement diagnostics. As you will appreciate, there is much work to be done and we will require clarity of purpose and vision to see this transformation through to fruition.

One of the ways we have begun extending our use of data for improvement is through *ALPS* Data training, which assists in informing the development of teaching and learning strategies. Data based analysis of results and incisive breakdown of data allow us to fully understand our performance and the steps required for further improvement. In essence this is a performance analysis of examination results which is designed to measure our progress against aspirational benchmarks based on the data base made up of real students sitting exams at GCSE and A level in the UK and internationally. The use of this data, along with other



tools, can help us to ensure all students achieve their potential as well as encourage or nurture a culture that is centred on continuous improvement: This is our first year in making use of such data and we have held training for middle and senior leaders to learn about its potential. 

Science Week

In November, we were fortunate to enjoy a week dedicated to Science at the SS.



The Science Faculty celebrated Science Week with many opportunities for students and staff to enjoy some Science learning. Biology Day started the week with activities that raised awareness on research exploring nature's inspiration in biomimicry product development (iridescence in currency, Nano-Tex fabric that repels liquids and stains which mimics the Lotus Effect) Velcro from burrs, fast swimsuits from shark skin and self-cooling buildings from termite dens) and a gardening activity aimed at creating useable lab materials. Day celebrations were filled with lots of colours and excitement with dry ice demos that filled the first break with the wonders of water bottle explosions and second break with a whoosh bottle rocket activity. The Physics day celebrations included full student participation in a Physics word guessing game as well as the opportunity for students to ask Physicists any within the "Adopt questions Physicist" programme. The Psychology department had activities demonstrating perception through optical illusions, discussed mindfulness and presented mindfulness activities and fun games displaying memory theories. The week ended with a Sciencethemed bake sale that raised over €350 euros for BirdLife Cyprus and our Science Park initiative for the purchase of a Solar Tree. We all appreciate the preparation and organisation of the week from Ms Iordanou and her Science Faculty team.

Business Week

November also saw the school celebrate Business Week with a number of activities related to the subjects of Economics, Business Studies, Accounting and Financial Education.

Buddies Without Borders – Continuing initiatives

The BWB is still going strong and is this year focused on the Sustainable Development Goal: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions. The intent is to contribute as a student collective to the most critical social inequities on a national and international level. As such, a range of activities and initiatives have been planned. The group plan to work with Mrs Filippou, Head of Music and the school orchestra and visit " $IPI\Delta A$ ", a therapeutic centre which provides multidisciplinary therapy, including music and art therapy for severely disabled young people and young adults in Nicosia. The visit will aim to communicate musically with the patients in a creative, non-verbal way through a short performance. BWB also plan to support the centre with a donation from the proceeds of a movie night (200 Euro raised!).

BWB have also been active in support of the Nicosia Dog Shelter via the campaign, *Paws for a Cause*. They are collecting urgently required supplies for the shelter whilst simultaneously highlighting the significant impact of local and global adversities on the wellbeing of animals. All students are being encouraged to donate products such as dog food, towels, blankets, beds, leashes, and toys.

Upcoming initiatives planned by this vibrant group include the idea of hosting a panel discussion with active, young individuals from Cyprus to promote the importance of the voice of young people in policy-making, including Helen Zhu, (SSL22), BWB's co-President last year who is currently a PPE student at Sommerville College, Oxford and, Christos Parmakkis, a local youth advocate and Cyprus' youth representative at the EU.
